## Marcel Béland, hero of Korea *Pierre Frigon (4)*

A simple letter that stayed in a drawer for more than fifty years can, even after all that time, move a perfect stranger to tears. That is exactly what happened to me when I received from Georges E. Frigon (93) a scanned copy of a letter written on August 10, 1952 by his brother-in-law, Marcel Béland (Martial to those close to him), a letter that was kept by his parents and then by one of his brothers until today.

Born in Baie-de-Shawinigan on March 4, 1931, Marcel is in Korea on this August 10, 1952. The war is raging. The Canadian Army is in a mountainous zone; military equipment is being transported along the edges of steep passes. The heat is unbearable in these war machines that advance at a snail's pace. Marcel is a chauffeur and his ordeal in this infernal heat lasts fifteen days with only a brief respite to relax and reflect.

Marcel feels very lonely but he comes to terms with the decision he made to enlist. He has just received a parcel from his family, dated July 31, containing some novels and (spaghetti ?). He really appreciates this gift! It is his parent's 25th wedding anniversary and he takes this opportunity to congratulate them. He feels guilty for not having been more attentive to his family while he was home and wishes he had done more little things to please them. The harshness of his present life makes him appreciate his loved ones and changes his outlook on life. His life will never again be the same; he resolves to become a better person when he returns to his country, a return he hopes for with every fibre of his being! "Pray for me," he writes from the depths of his hell.

This touching letter was to be the last he would ever send

to his parents. Nine days later, he died under enemy fire, a piece of shrapnel from an exploding shell lodged in his head. He was 21 years old. He was buried in the United Nations Cemetery (Pusan) in Tanggok, on the outskirts of Pusan in South Korea.

The following is a transcription of the complete letter. If you ponder over each of Marcel's words, you, too, will be deeply moved by this letter.

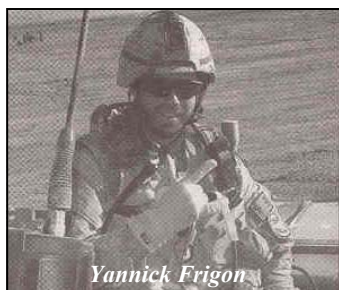
Genealogy, like antique collecting, recalls our past,

Andréanne Bouchard of Trois-Rivières, co-pilot.

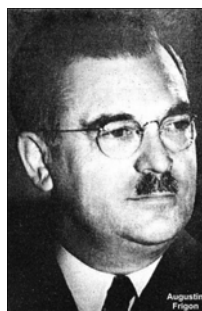

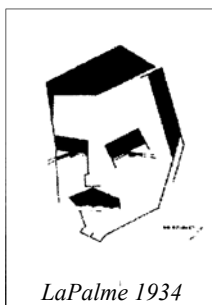
**THE FRIGON TROPHY IN THE '50s**



The Frigon Trophy was awarded in the '50s to people working in the field of French television in Canada: ex. Clémence Desrochers, an actress in the Famille Plouffe series; Claude Jutra, scriptwriter for the first television drama; Roger Garceau, best television actor; Michelle Tisseyre, best television host; Michel Louvain, most popular artist in 1958.

Augustin Frigon was one of three members of the Royal Commission on radio-broadcasting (1928-1929) whose report determined the orientation of Canadian broadcasting for decades. He was the first Assistant Director (1936-1943) at the time of the founding of the Société Radio-Canada. He later became Director General (1944-1951). The trophy was created in his honour.

**THE AUGUSTIN-FRIGON CONFERENCES**

Last October 9th, The *École Polytechnique de Montréal* presented its 41st Augustin-Frigon Conference. Zaki Laïdi, a researcher at the *Centre d'études internationales de Paris* was the speaker. The title of the conference was "La Crise de la gouvernance mondiale" (The crisis of world governance).

Augustin Frigon was a student at the *École Polytechnique de Montréal* (1905-1909), then professor (1910-1928), Director of the Electricity Laboratories (1910-1920), Director of Studies (1923-1935), and Principal

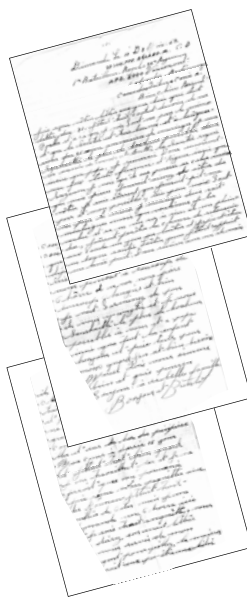

edge of precipices. My ordeal lasted 15 days and I felt very well when I was not working and had nothing to do but walk around. I received your (spaghetti?) along with the novels. I was very pleased with these gifts, but I am wondering about something and it worries me a lot. You told me in your letters that you are using my money to (repair?) the house. I might have had an idea

different from yours but I am continually thinking about you. I know that in the past I sometimes did things that were not right and I am here to improve myself. Here we do a lot of thinking and that can make us change. Well, I am going to close now for fear of boring you and I wish you and Papa all the happiness possible, and to all the children as well. Goodbye to all of you, and pray for me for I need it very much. Marcel who loves you very much and is always thinking about his wonderful family  
Goodbye. See you soon.

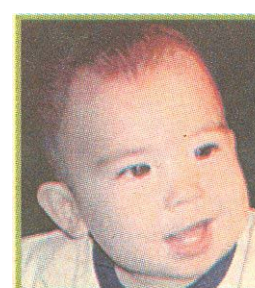

#### THE SURNAME FLORENTINE RELATED TO THE FRIGONS

We believe that there exists a surname FLORENTINE, derived from Frigon. François "Frank" Frigon, son of Simon Frigon, adopted the name François "Frank" Florentine. This medical doctor had two sons and we know that one of these also had two sons. These last guardians of the name Florentine were born at the beginning of the 1900s.

However, our research is not sufficiently advanced to be able to affirm that all Florentines are descendants of Frank. In the United States, there are 184 Florentines listed in the Meta Crawler Annual Directory, and two in Canada, but (T.N:statistically) the number is too high for all of them to be descendants of Frank Florentine.

The research is to be continued!

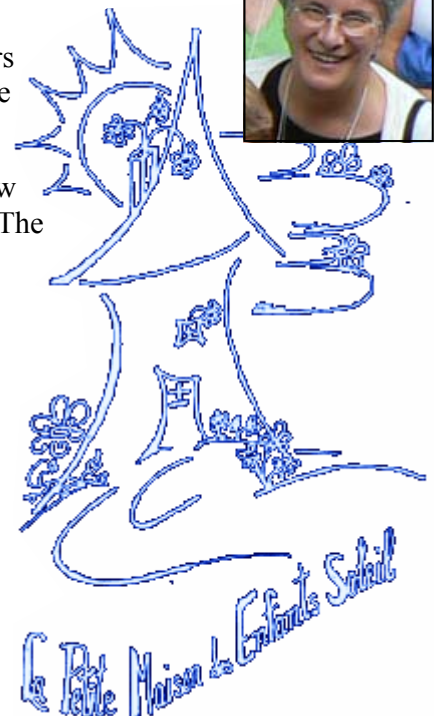
