Her love of caring for others continued past her retirement, as she acted as caretaker for her many great-grandchildren. Joyce had a very special relationship with her granddaughter, Laura Wyne, of Spencer, and her great-granddaughter, Jordan Gablaski, of East Brookfield, both of whom had the privilege of spending many years with their grandmother before and after school, and during vacations. Joyce will be remembered as a devoted grandmother; always standing up for her grandchildren, always a gentle hand to hold, a warm hug to rely on.
