
92 PLACE OF ORIGIN OF FRANÇOIS FRIGON DIT L'ESPAGNOL Claude Frigon (aff256), Secretary

At this year's Annual General Meeting, a presentation was made to communicate the state of research in France on the place of origin of our ancestor.

At the 2017 Annual General Meeting in Sainte-Geneviève-de-Batiscan, we were told that François Frigon and Marie-Claude Chamois were married in the department of La Manche.

This announcement was made following the receipt of a marriage certificate that Mr. J.P. Macouin sent to the Association in May 2017. This document states that the parents of François Frigon resided in "the parish of Saint-Vandrille from the commune of Francquetot ".


With this information in hand, a compilation of municipalities in the department of La Manche was made to target this place more precisely since the municipality of Francquetot no longer exists having been integrated, presumably, in the current town of Cretteville. This compilation made it possible to establish a list of 39 communes located 20 km or less from Cretteville. A consultation of the digitized departmental



In addition, another compilation of all occurrences of the surname "Frigon" found to date reveals that the name was listed 35 times in the archives between 1388 and 1890.

The presentation illustrated the results of this research and identified the most likely area where the marriage of François and Marie-Claude took place. Unfortunately, it has not yet been possible, at the time of the meeting, to identify the birthplace of our ancestor.

The presentation ended with an invitation to all participants to consult our website and join the research team and continue the work.

It is well known that our colleague Jean-René Frigon (aff11) has been working for more than two years on the complete redesign of the Association's website.

At the 2016 Annual General Meeting in Batiscan, this new site was mentioned but there was no detailed presentation.

This year, the Association wanted to make a formal presentation of the site despite the absence for health reasons of the person responsible for its development.

This new site deserved and deserves even more to be known by all especially because of the large amount of information it contains.

The presentation, on behalf of Jean-René, had the following objectives:

- show how to access the site from a search engine such as Google, for example, and explain the different tabs found on the home page.

Each tab has been opened and commented on and several examples of links have been posted.

Obviously, the high point was the tab and the function "Research" which allows users to find many documents collected and compiled by the Association.

During the presentation, the link between the website and the BK (Brother's Keeper) database was highlighted to indicate that

- every individual included in the Association's database has a 5-character identification number (eg: (00001) for François Frigon, our ancestor)
- and each member of the Association has a membership number (eg Jean-René (aff11)).

Attendees at the meeting showed a lot of interest and asked relevant questions, making the presentation both dynamic and relaxed.

The presentation ended with a tribute to Jean-René (aff11).

Here is an excerpt from an article by Marcel Fournier concerning the documents sent by Mr. Jean-Paul Macouin in May 2017.

Today has testified the illustrious and reverend Messire François de Laval, the first bishop of Quebec, being present in Paris for the affairs of his church, housed in the seminar of foreign missions on Rue du Bac, who after seeing a certificate signed in Champlain by François Dupré, dated August 25, 1686, relating to the celebration by a priest of the seminary of the said Quebec acting as parish priest in Batiscan on 10.11.1670, of the marriage between François Frigon, son of the deceased Yves, and Marguerite Ferré of the parish of St Vandrille, in the village of Francquetôt, diocese of Coutances in Basse-Normandie, on the one hand and Marie Chamoy, daughter of the late Henri and Jacqueline Girard, of the parish of Saint-Paul de Paris, on the other hand.


A letter coming from the said Quebec dated 02.11.1686, written by De St-Claude, parish priest of the said Batiscan to Mrs. Miromont for her to transfer the letter to Mrs. Frigon in Paris. The said Lord Bishop of Quebec informed all that the said certificates and letters are signed, namely the certificate by the hand of the Sieur François Dupré, parisht priest of said Champlain, and the missive by the hand of the said De St-Claude parish priest of the said Batiscan. Because the said lord said he knew the signatures well.

Followed the transmission of the documents addressed to Mrs. Miromont, rue de la Verrerie to Sieur Balard potter, for Mrs. Frigon.

Analysis of the act from Paris by Marcel Fournier:



A research about the birthplace of François Frigon indicates that the hamlet of Francquetot existed well in the seventeenth century between the current municipalities of Cretteville and Coigny in the department of La Manche. On the other hand, the parish of Saint-Vandrille or Saint-Wandrille poses a problem since it cannot be found in the vicinity of these two communes in past centuries. It may be that Saint-Vandrille is the name of a chapel or abbey of the region but this possibility cannot be confirmed to date because according to the Cassini map, Francquetot was a hamlet without a church.

Moreover, genealogists, members of the Genealogy Circle of La Manche, have recently traced in the databases of the Genealogical Circle, the marriage certificate of François Frigon's sister. The transcript of the act, which is not the original, reads as follows:

On July 18th [1682], marriage to Étienne Grévin, Son of Jean and Marie Pilon and Jeanne Frigon, daughter of Yves and Marguerite Ferey³.

Note from the editor: Pierre conducted a search to determine if the parish of Vandrille is a parish of Cretteville or a parish of Coigny. Be sure to read the next newsletters. A series of articles by Pierre will try to clarify the issue.


